INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANTS

This application is to request authorization under the DEC General Permit for cleanup and repair work in and along the Lake Ontario and St. Lawrence River shoreline in the counties of Cayuga, Jefferson, Monroe, Niagara, Orleans, Oswego, Saint Lawrence and Wayne, in DEC Regions 6, 7, 8 and 9; necessitated by the Lake Ontario high water level of April- May, 2017.

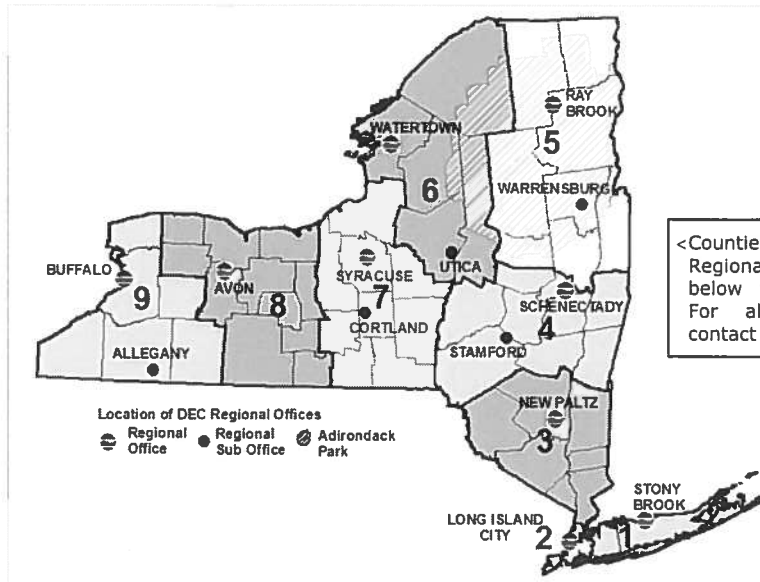
This General Permit authorizes specific types of repair and stabilization work while eliminating the usual application procedures and public notification requirements.

To obtain the required authorization under this General Permit:

1. Read the General Permit to ensure that you understand all terms and conditions.
2. Determine whether or not the work you propose to do is within the scope of the General Permit. (Refer to Description of Authorized Activities, Type of Projects, Nos. 1 through 7). If it is not, contact the Regional Permit Administrator to apply for an individual permit. If it is, proceed with Step 3 below.
3. Fill out the Application for General Permit GP-0-17-006. Make sure all asterisk (*) entries are complete and legible. Provide drawings, plans, photos (if available), and a location map. Read the certification and sign and date the application.
4. Give the completed application to the DEC field representative (Habitat Biologist, Engineer or Environmental Analyst), or mail/email them to the Regional Permit Administrator (see next page for Agency Contact Information). If the project is approved, the authorized DEC representative will then countersign the Application/Authorization form and hand it to you or mail it with a copy of the General Permit.
5. Ensure that those doing the actual work understand and comply with all terms and conditions of the General Permit.
6. Contact the Regional Permit Administrator if you have questions or encounter unforeseen problems during the course of the work.

*Project Description:

*Type of Project:

- 7 Repair and in-kind replacement of erosion protection structures that were functional on April 1, 2017 that do not extend waterward of the pre-existing footprint. Increase in structure height is permissible subject to Department approval. Replacement structures must be adequately sized and designed to current standards.
- 7 Repair or reconstruction of existing public roads, bridges, utilities and other public infrastructure.
- 7 Stabilization of existing functional storm-damaged dwellings, decks and walkways with temporary bracing and pilings.
- 7 Repair or reconstruction of elevated walk ways or stairways necessary for water access. The stairs and landings shall be a maximum of 4 feet in width and constructed a minimum of 18 inches above grade over the dune/bluff face.
- 7 Minor grading back of scarped bluffs to a stable slope. Project must include approved vegetation plan. Toe stone for stabilization may be allowed in specific circumstances.
- 7 Removal of debris by use of motorized equipment.
- 7 Temporary installation of sand bags for flood protection above MHW within the Coastal Erosion Hazard Area.
- 7 Repair or reconstruction of docks, catwalks and floats that were functional on April 1, 2017.

I have read this permit and will construct and operate this project in strict compliance with the approved plans and terms and conditions of this permit as well as the Environmental Conservation Law and applicable regulations. I understand that any false or inaccurate statements made in the application for this permit are punishable as a Class A misdemeanor. As a condition of this permit, I accept full legal responsibility for all damage, direct or indirect, of whatever nature, and by whomever suffered, arising out of the project described herein and agree to indemnify and save harmless the state from suits, actions, damages, and costs of every name and description resulting from this project.
