#### QUARTERLY WATER/SEWER REPORT RECEIVED AND FILED

#### COMMUNICATIONS:

Clerk Connolly reported that Assemblyman Hawley will be hosting a bus tour for Veterans to Washington DC in September.

## **REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITATIVE (RGGI)**

Clerk Connolly said resolutions have been received from the Towns of Cambria, Hartland and Pendleton supporting the RGGI resolution that the Town adopted.

Councilman Engert said that Jim Hoffman was responsible for calling upon the Board to take action regarding the environmental impact that this initiative has on AES. He stated he has been in contact with Assemblyman Hawley's office and he will be sending a letter of support to the Governor regarding this issue. He announced that he has asked the plaintiff, Lisa Thrun who is part of a lawsuit that has been filed in NY challenging the state's participation in RGGI and her organization, Americans For Prosperity, to come to the town to present an information forum for the residents to be educated on the destructive economic impact that RGGI has locally. He said they will be at the Town Hall on August 16<sup>th</sup> at 3:30PM for a press conference and then at 6PM for the seminar. He stated that Senator Maziarz may be in attendance and that Americans for Prosperity is supporting the Town's resolution.

#### RESOLUTION 83-2011

#### ADDITIONAL PAY FOR ASSESSOR CLERK

Councilman Jansen stated she met with Assessor Glidden to formulate a project plan where activity and resources are tracked for the revaluation. Discussion ensued regarding the project plan, the proposed budget amendment for \$3,000.00, the increased hours that Assessor Glidden has worked, salaried positions receiving extra compensation, the contract with Brisbane Consulting Group, LLC for assessing commercial properties, additional help that will be needed to conduct the revaluation, possible 2011 budgetary requests, farm values and updating the project plan.

Assessor Glidden stated it would amount to \$1,998.00 until the end of the year with the Clerk working 16 hours more a month until October and then working all the hours the office is open.

Clerk Connolly stated the Planning Board has forwarded proposed local laws to change the Code of the Town of Somerset for the Board's consideration.

Attorney Jones stated that NYS mandates the Town adopts this ordinance. He stated this will allow Code Enforcement Officer Hildebrant to enforce the NYS Building Codes which contains 11 different elements.

Attorney Jones said the Special Use Permit provisions are not covered by state law and the current Administration and Enforcement code contains several areas where Special Use Permit are required. He stated that it is easier to adopt a new law specifically for Special Use Permits.

Discussion ensued regarding different sections of the laws with explanations given by Attorney Jones, Code Enforcement Officer Hildebrant and Planning Board Chairman Jon Hotaling.

Extensive discussion ensued regarding the need for a noise law, the hours that are set, how the law will be enforced, and the need to allow snow blowers to run anytime of the day or night. Police Chief Annable, Planning Board Chairman Hotaling and Attorney Jones explained the noise law.

WHEREAS, the State of New York has an estimated 2.5 million residents without health insurance; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Somerset currently carries insurance coverage for its full-time employees and part-time Elected Officials; and

WHEREAS, due to the Town policy, the Town has not elected in the past to fund insurance for part-time employees or to allow for their participation in the Town's insurance plan; and

WHEREAS, the lack of insurance coverage options for part-time employees may leave those in the employ of the Town of Somerset without health-care insurance options for themselves and/or their family.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that effective upon adoption of this resolution, the Town of Somerset shall provide the option to its part-time employees to purchase self-paid health insurance under the Town's health insurance policy, and that Section 806 of the Town of Somerset Employee Handbook shall be revised to reflect such change.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town will offer this coverage to its parttime employees so long as there is no additional premium or deductible cost to the Town of Somerset.

# SPEED LIMIT ON LAKE ROAD BETWEEN QUAKER ROAD AND HOSMER ROAD

Supervisor Meyers stated that the intersection at Hartland Road and Lake Road is dangerous and a resident asked him to have the speed limit lowered for the current 45 MPH on Lake Road west of Quaker Road to Hosmer Road to 45 MPH.

Superintendent Bigelow stated that he will contact the property owners to discuss the sight distance problem.
