COMMUNICATIONS:

Clerk Carmer read a letter received from Betty Wolanyk. She expressed her frustration at not having a Privilege of the Floor section during our Zoom meetings. She thanked the Board for passing the moratorium on solar but feels that there should also be a moratorium

on industrial scale battery storage. Betty stated that there are rumors of an 850 acre solar project being undertaken by the power plant and she plans to look into that further. She asked what is the status of the activity at the power plant; when will the public be made aware; what is the Town Board's attitude about this situation and local control; and will Beowulf ever be held accountable if this proceeds?

Clerk Carmer also read a letter submitted by James Hoffman. He feels that there are some issues to address with the demolition of the power plant such as monitoring the activity for noise, dust, traffic, etc.; hours of operation; what will be done with the debris; will oversize and overweight loads be on local roads; how many people will be employed; will traffic be a problem; how will toxic materials, if any, be disposed of; brownfield status; and periodic briefings to the Town Board on the status of activity. He stated that the site is zoned a Planned Unit Development requiring a plan by Hereot before any development takes place. He asked what is the status of this. Jim wants to know the status of the property acquisition for the Multiple Use Plan and asked if the committee can be reactivated? He also wants to know the status on the Data Center. Regarding solar, he feels that we need to know what the plans are so we can have some input well before an application is made. He asked if Somerset is involved in the Rails to Trails project. He feels that it fits nicely into the MUP. Jim also asked what is the Town's involvement in the Northern Niagara Regional Trail Network? And he inquired about the status of the REDI Grant and asked if part of it can be used for its original purpose?

Supervisor Dewart stated that we will look for answers and will probably have a public meeting in May or June.

FIVE STAR EQUIPMENT SOLE SOURCE

WHEREAS, the Town of Somerset owns a John Deere Model 644H wheel loader, and

WHEREAS, said wheel loader is in need of servicing and new parts; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Highways has researched vendors and servicers of John Deere wheel loaders and found that the only entity in the western New York area that provides services and parts for John Deere Model 644H wheel loaders is Five Star Equipment, Inc., and

WHEREAS, Five Star Equipment, Inc. has confirmed with the Superintendent of Highways that it is the sole source servicer and supplier of John Deere Model 644H wheel loaders and wheel loader parts in the western New York area, and

WHEREAS, Five Star Equipment, Inc. has provided the Town an estimate for all servicing and parts necessary for the repair, restoration and reconditioning of the Town's wheel loader for a total amount of \$10,589.65.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Five Star Equipment, Inc. is found to be the sole source servicer and supplier of John Deere Model 644H wheel loaders and wheel loader parts, and as such constitutes an exception to the Town of Somerset's Procurement Policy, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent of Highways is authorized to enter into a contract to restore and repair the Town's John Deere Model 644H wheel loader for the amount of \$10,589.65 without the need to obtain three written quotes from three separate vendors.

Councilman Hotaling representing Herbert W. Carr Post 425, discussed the banner project that they undertook and showed the audience what one of the banners looks like. He said that they have 53 banners which will be hung in May on Quaker Road from High Street to Lake Road, on every pole that has a street light. There will be six banners placed on Main Street and there will still be more left to hang. At noon on Memorial Day there will be a small dedication ceremony at the gazebo in the Village.

Attorney Haylett spoke on the questions that were presented in the letters that were read by Clerk Carmer. He said that if the Board desires, we can go back to holding public meetings in person. Also, if the Board would like to place a moratorium on battery storage he can have the resolution ready for our next meeting. He stated that we had started an Infrastructure Preservation Law to protect the roads but it was put on hold. He will look for that.
